UCP Easter Seals Heartland's mission:

To provide the highest quality of programs, services and supports while advancing the independence, productivity and full citizenship of individuals with disabilities.

- On October 1, 2008 United Cerebral Palsy of Greater St. Louis and Easter Seals Missouri merged to create UCP Easter Seals Heartland. The merger allowed for services to be provided to even more children and adults in a more effective manner
- The Child Development Center received the only 5 star rating in Columbia from the OPEN Initiative's Quality Rating System.
- UCP Easter Seals was reaccredited through the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation facilities (CARF) and received an exemplary rating for the Employment Collaborative Program.
- The Employment Collaborative Program was recognized with the 2008 Cutting Edge Award by the Missouri Association of County Developmental Disability Services (MACDDS).
- Greg Fuesting chaired the annual Mardi Gras Dinner Auction held at the Ritz-Carlton.
- John and Julie McArthur of Johnny Mac's Sporting Goods chaired Walk With Me St. Louis at Forest Park.
- Dr. Frank and Donna Bemis chaired the 1st Annual Deal or No Deal event in Southwestern Illinois.

Program Impact

In fiscal year 2009, UCP Easter Seals Heartland provided 382,042 hours of direct care services to more than 1,121 people. An additional 3,708 people benefitted from indirect services including resource and referral, disability awareness, advocacy and autism training.

(Figures are representative of services of United Cerebral Palsy of Greater St. Louis from July 1, 2008 through September 30, 2008 and the merged UCP Easter Seals Heartland from October 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009).

Success Stories

- 100% of children who participated in Early Intervention for at least 6 months demonstrated developmental gains.
- In-Facility Respite, Summer Day Camp and Employment Resources programs all posted a 100% Satisfaction Rate.
- 100% of In Facility Respite consumers and 98% of In- Home Respite consumers maintained their residency in their natural home and community.
- UCPESH Children's Services Department provided direct care services to over 450 children in Missouri and Southern Illinois.
- The Maryville Autism Center achieved 100% of The Autism Program required deliverables.




